Background: The Toronto Human Immunology was founded in the fall of 2010 and currently has 55 faculty members, led by a director (Tania Watts) and a steering committee (see web site). In April 2011, the network was recognized as a FOCIS center of Excellence. The Network is also one of the founding members of **CHIN**, the CIHR human Immunology network (https://www.schulich.uwo.ca/cihr-human-immunology-network).

The **mandate** of the Toronto Human Immunology Network is to facilitate translational human immunology by providing linkages among individuals and groups involved in basic through to clinical Human Immunology research across the city; to provide a forum for discussion of new

developments in translational human immunology; to educate trainees in translational human immunology; to facilitate interactions between those doing trials and those with research questions/assays to study immunology in human cohorts; to facilitate the acquisition and access of our members to shared infrastructure and to provide a mechanism for interacting with national and international groups involved in Human Immunology. The network is also attempting to help coordinate team efforts in human immunology. To date the Network has catalyzed the formation of groups going forward for the Connaught Global Challenge, the Medicine Innovation and Integration grants and the CIHR chronic inflammation grants competition.

Human Immunology Network events: The network sponsors Panel discussions in human immunology, an adjunct to the Easton seminar series in which 4-5 speakers per year are chosen in the area of Human Immunology and are invited to participate in a round table discussion at the end of the day of their seminar in which specific aspects such as bottlenecks to translation of human immunology are discussed. In addition, the network has an **annual symposium** in which we highlight one particular subspecialty of human immunology. Previous topics have included Population Immunology of viral infections and vaccines (Feb. 2011, cochairs Natasha Crowcroft, Public Health Ontario and Tania Watts, Immunology) and Decoding the Influence of the Microbiota on Health and Disease (May, 2012, cochairs Ken Croitoru and Dana Philpott).

The national human immunology network, CHIN is sponsoring 7 Café Scientifique across the country- our local contribution will be to hold a session on new immunotherapies for cancer, with speakers Naoto Hirano and Marcus Butler.
