Reminder for trainees: to be eligible for the Jim Watts travel award in Human Immunology they must present a human immunology poster or talk at the **Departmental Retreat**: June 20-21, 2017 - YMCA Geneva Park, Orillia, Ontario.

Award Description:

This year, the **Jim Watts travel award in Human Immunology** will be presented for the first time. This travel award (\$1000) to be used toward the academic conference of your choice. Awarded for the best human immunology focused presentation at the Department Retreat presented by a trainee (grad student or post-doc).

Criteria:

- Students/post docs should indicate if they want to be judged for the Jim Watts travel award when they submit their abstract (post docs giving oral presentation can also be considered)
- Subject of poster presentation or talk must be focused on human immune system (i.e. analysis of human immune system rather than mouse models of human disease)
- ♦ Judges will rank human immunology presentations and select 1 winner
- ◆ Funds will be administered by Department of Immunology and awarded upon provision of original receipts for attendance at the conference using the Department of Immunology expense form and subject to normal U of T travel expense regulations
- Conference attended by the awardee should be an academic, immunology related conference, subject to the approval of their PI
