





Dear Immunologists,

This past month of September, we embraced new faces into our community and welcomed familiar ones back with open arms.

In the past month alone, we organized an open workshop on Imposter Syndrome, a Departmental picnic at Christie Pits Park, and a first-year orientation trip to Canada's Wonderland. This only reflects a fraction of the hard work that the IGSA 2020-21 council has poured into building, reinforcing, and creating community over this past year.

Since last September, our council has hosted 4 outdoor picnics, 3 career-oriented workshops, 7 PhD Qualifying Exam practice sessions, and 20+ virtual social events, including movie nights, games nights, trivia nights, virtual cooking classes, a gingerbread-building competition, magic show, and more. Additionally, we organized and executed our annual Holiday Party on Zoom for the very first time, and our second virtual Summer Retreat, a 2day conference featuring keynote speaker Dr. Akiko Iwasaki among other notable UofT Immunology alumni. We offered screenings of the documentary "Picture a Scientist" to shed light on the barriers women scientists have faced and still face today in STEM, prompting important conversations about gender equity; anti-racism workshops in collaboration with the Faculty of Medicine Office of Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion, and Anti-Racism and Cultural Diversity Office; and raised over \$500 CAD for local charities from fundraising initiatives, including Nelly's Women Shelter and Toronto-based Indigenous youth charities. Anthony Wong and Ling Ling Tai on our council were also executives of the Graduate Peer Support Network, a new mental health and wellness initiative funded by the GLSE and spearheaded by Faculty of Medicine students. And Baweleta Isho and Annie Pu were coleads of the outreach initiative IMMspire, which reached over a dozen schools in the Toronto District School Board to educate high school students about immunology, which is now more important than ever.
